Compatibility and Standards

Cable trays are designed to support various types of cables, including power, control, and communication lines, provided the cables are approved for tray use and meet the National Electrical Code (NEC) Article 392 requirements. BTLY cables, commonly used for low-voltage power and control applications, must be verified as tray-rated to ensure they can withstand heat, moisture, and mechanical stress typical in tray installations.

Installation Considerations

- **Tray Type:** Ladder trays are preferred for power and control cables due to excellent ventilation and heat dissipation, while solid-bottom or ventilated trough trays may be used where additional protection is needed.
- **Tray Fill:** NEC specifies maximum fill limits—typically 40% for power cables and 50% for control cables—to prevent overheating and allow maintenance.
- **Separation:** High-power and low-power cables should be separated to reduce electromagnetic interference (EMI) and maintain signal integrity.
- **Support and Routing:** Cables should be bundled and supported at regular intervals to prevent sagging or mechanical stress. Ladder tray rungs should be spaced appropriately for small-diameter cables to avoid drooping.
