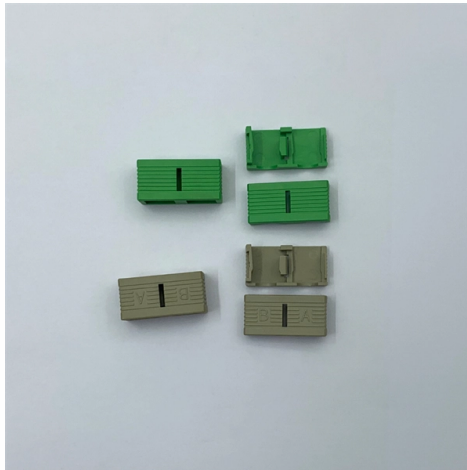


Color requirements for jumper wires in distribution boxes



Article Overview

Jumper wires in distribution boxes are typically color-coded according to their function: green or green/yellow for ground, blue or white for neutral, and other colors like black, brown, or red for live connections.

Standard Color Codes

Ground (Protective Earth): Green or green with a yellow stripe is universally used for grounding wires in both IEC and NEC standards, ensuring safety by preventing electric shock . **Neutral:** Blue (IEC) or white/gray (NEC) is used for neutral wires, which carry current back to the source . **Live (Line/Hot):** Colors for live wires vary by region and system. Commonly used colors include black, brown, or red. In single-phase AC systems, any color other than green, yellow, blue, or white can be used for live wires, but black and brown are most frequent . **Jumper Wires:** In distribution boxes, jumper wires are often used to connect multiple terminals or phases. Their color usually matches the function they serve:

- Live jumpers: Black, brown, or red
- Neutral jumpers: Blue or white
- Ground jumpers: Green or green/yellow

Regional and Standard Variations

- IEC (Europe, UK, and many other countries): Follows IEC 60446, which standardizes green/yellow for earth, blue for neutral, and brown for live .
