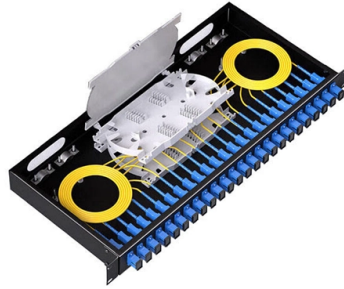


Is the core switch running at full load



Article Overview

A core switch is considered at full load when its CPU utilization or system load consistently approaches the maximum capacity of its processor cores, potentially impacting packet forwarding and network performance.

Understanding Core Switch Load

A core switch aggregates traffic from multiple distribution and access switches, handling high-capacity data flows across the network backbone. Its CPU manages system processes and packet handling, but unlike access switches, it is optimized for high throughput and low latency, offloading many tasks to specialized hardware. Even under normal conditions, a core switch CPU rarely reports 0% utilization due to background processes and hardware communication.

CPU Utilization and Load Metrics

- **CPU Utilization (%):** Measures the instantaneous percentage of CPU time used by system processes. Spikes can occur during topology changes, configuration updates, or broadcast storms.
- **Load Average:** Represents the average number of processes waiting for CPU time over 1, 5, and 15 minutes. On a multi-core switch, a load equal to the number of cores indicates full CPU usage. For example, a dual-core switch with a load of 2.0 is fully loaded.
- **Normal Ranges:** Typical baseline CPU utilization ranges from 5-40% on non-stacked switches, slightly higher on stacked configurations. Temporary spikes up to 80-100% may be normal if caused by known network events.
