Article Overview

Standard 19-inch network racks use a vertical hole spacing pattern of $1/2'' - 5/8'' - 5/8''$ within each 1.75-inch rack unit, with horizontal spacing of 18.312 inches between vertical rails.

Vertical Hole Spacing

The vertical spacing of holes in a standard 19-inch rack follows the EIA-310-D specification. Each rack unit (1U) measures 1.75 inches (44.45 mm) in height. Within this 1U, holes are arranged in a repeating pattern of $1/2$ inch – $5/8$ inch – $5/8$ inch, measured center-to-center. This three-hole group pattern ensures proper alignment for rack-mountable equipment and is consistent whether the rack uses square or round holes. The start and stop of the U-space is centered on the $1/2$ -inch spaced hole, which helps prevent misalignment when installing rails or equipment .

Horizontal Hole Spacing

The horizontal spacing between the two vertical rows of mounting holes is standardized at $18 \frac{5}{16}$ inches (18.312 inches or 465.1 mm), measured from center-to-center of the holes. This dimension defines the width of the mounting flanges on equipment panels and ensures compatibility across different manufacturers .
