

Should the cable tray sections be centered



Article Overview

Cable trays do not always need to be centered; their placement depends on structural support, obstruction rules, and maintenance access requirements.

Placement Considerations

Cable trays are primarily support structures for electrical cables and must be installed to ensure stability, safety, and accessibility. According to NEC Article 392, trays should be securely supported at key points such as the beginning, end, corners, T-junctions, and spans over 30 meters to prevent sagging and maintain system integrity. The exact horizontal or vertical centering is not mandated; instead, the focus is on proper support and spacing to allow for maintenance, inspection, and heat dissipation.

Obstruction and Clearance Rules

NFPA 13 and other obstruction guidelines indicate that cable trays may be centered under some sprinklers or offset to the side for others, depending on the specific obstruction criteria. This flexibility ensures that the tray does not interfere with fire suppression systems while maintaining safe access for technicians. Adequate spacing between parallel trays (minimum 0.6 meters) and between power and signal trays (minimum 0.5 meters, or 0.3 meters if shielded) is critical to reduce electromagnetic interference and allow airflow.
